## **GENERAL PROGRAM UPDATE**

The Nursing Assistant program last ran in the Spring of 2021 and was taught by a part-time instructor. The last full-time tenured faculty who led and taught the program retired in the Spring of 2020. COVID-19 imposed many restrictions on the clinical sites and the program was not allowed to use long-term care facilities to deliver the clinical practicum. Although some of the COVID-19 restrictions have been lifted allowing other programs to use the long-term care sites, the nursing assistant program has faced instructor recruitment challenges. The program was taught in the Spring of 2021 however the instructor was not available to continue teaching the program due to the instructor accepting a full-time teaching position in another program. Recruitments for part-time instructors have been ongoing every semester without success. Part-time pool recruitment is underway, and discussions about possibly offering the program in the summer pending instructor availability have been held. The program had in the past benefitted from the donation of a second instructor from Compass Health. An instructor was donated in the spring of 2021 when the program obtained a part-time instructor.





The last recorded enrollment for the program was in the 2020-21 academic year when a cohort of 19 students enrolled in NAST 148 and NAST 148L completed the program in the Spring 2021 semester. The cap for the program during this semester was set to 18 due to COVID restrictions imposed by the clinical sites however one extra student was admitted into the program. The part-time instructor hired for the program was not available to teach in the subsequent semester.





The program is highly desirable and also helps students meet the requirement for entry eligibility into the Licensed Vocational Nursing program. Data is not available for the 2021-22 academic year due a to lack of available instructors and unsuccessful recruitment efforts.

The efficiency rate for the program has declined across the past five academic years. The cap for each of the two courses within this program is 30. In Spring 2021 only 19 students were allowed to enroll in the program due to COVID restrictions imposed by the clinical practicum sites. The program was not offered in the Fall of 2020 due to the pandemic. The program has in previous years enrolled above the enrollment cap due to the availability of more instructors however due to retirements and the pandemic, the program has not been able to run at full capacity.

The nursing assistant program is only offered face-to-face due to curriculum and accrediting board requirements. The course completion in comparison to the college for this modality is high and achieved a 95% completion rate in spring 2021.


## E. Degrees and Certificates Awarded (Insert Data Chart)

The program was delivered only in the spring semester during 2020-2021 due to pandemic restrictions by the clinical sites. The program enrolls 30 students in each of the two courses for a total of 60. The data demonstrates awarding of certificates for the majority of students enrolled in the program each semester for the previous five academic years.






The program demonstrates course completion above the college rates with spring 2021 demonstrating a 20% completion rate above the college rate.

The data demonstrate program diversity however the Black or African-American success is 60%. This may be due to low enrollment numbers in this particular ethnic group.



Data shows a greater than 85% student subpopulation for all age groups. The Nursing Assistant program serves as an introductory course for students interested in the healthcare field or seeking to advance their careers. Due to the pandemic and retention challenges, it is difficult to

assess current equity gaps in the prior academic year. The program does not have faculty at this time and currently has an interim program director.
