STUDENT REPRESENTATION FEE WAIVER

The \$1.00 Student Representation Fee is applicable during the Spring and Fall terms only. This fee is used solely by the Cuesta College student government (ASCC) to advocate and lobby for student legislative issues before city, county, state, and/or federal government. The Student Representation Fee cannot be used to support individual candidates or campaigns.

Any student may for religious, political, financial, or moral reasons refuse to pay this fee by completing this fee waiver form each semester and submitting the fee waiver form *prior to registering*. This fee is non-refundable once the semester starts.

Effective Spring 2016, Enrichment students (concurrently enrolled at Cuesta while in high school) are exempt from paying this fee and do not need to submit a waiver request.

HOW WILL THE STUDENT REPRESENTATION FEE BE USED?

The Student Representation Fee is a fee that the Associated Student Governments are allowed to implement according to Education Code 76060.5. This \$1.00 fee can only be utilized by the ASCC to fund any number of the following opportunities for students:

- 1. Attendance at conferences and meetings of student non-partisan organizations.
- Organizational dues and/or special donations to the statewide student organizations or any other recognized student lobby association that works on behalf of community college students.
- Purchasing of equipment used for lobbying and/or advocacy such as computers, printers, faxes, modems, software, and accessories.
- 4. Subscriptions to newsletters and/or magazines of higher education.
- 5. Advertisements consisting of information about legislative issues of interest to the student body at large.
- 6. Travel expenses for lobbying and/or advocacy for students.
- 7. Leadership training, awareness, and information.
- 8. Hosting non-partisan conferences on legislative issues.
